Current vs proposed new policy




Defines	New policy if it includes ODC	Current policy as per Cabinet Minute
Govt's level of commitment	Govt commits internationally via OGP	Cabinet gets agencies to commit
Value and use of open govt data	ODC mentions economic, social, cultural & environmental plus transparency & global benefits.	Declaration mentions economic, social, cultural & environmental benefits plus accountable govt.
Organisations to respond and how much	We are seeking your input on this.	Directed, encouraged, invited
Machinery of govt for open data	We are seeking your input on this.	Steering group, work programme and reporting.
Principles for managing and releasing data	ODC provides substantially more detail.	DIMP provides broad principles with some detail.
Engagement with and support for data users	ODC emphasises consultation and support for using data.	Not addressed. newzealand.govt.nz
